POWER METER BLAZE CONTINUES TO PLAY HAVOC IN MULUND

Following the recent fire incident at Girijabai Society's electricity meter cabin in Mulund East, another concerning event unfolded as Lok Everest Society's meter cabin in Mulund West became engulfed in flames. The recurrence of these meter cabin fires has prompted heightened concerns, prompting swift action from the authorities.

On a fateful Wednesday, a fire ignited within the meter cabin of Lok Everest Cooperative Housing Society in Mulund West, coincidentally during a busy morning when residents were present. The gravity of the situation prompted an immediate call to

the fire brigade, who promptly dispatched firefighters to the scene. Fortunately, their rapid response succeeded in containing the blaze within an hour, averting a potential disaster.

These meter cabin fires seem to be increasing in frequency, with a previous incident at Girijabai Co-operative Housing Society in Mulund East narrowly avoided due to timely intervention during the night. Unfortunately, this distressing pattern repeated itself this past Wednesday when the meter cabin of the prestigious Lok Everest residential building also succumbed to flames.

Given the escalating occurrences of

meter cabin fires in Mumbai, Mulund, and neighbouring areas, Mahavitaran has taken action by issuing regulations to both municipal administration and cooperative housing societies, recognizing the seriousness of the issue. Tragically, past incidents have claimed numerous lives.

Meter cabins are often situated adjacent to main entrance staircases, creating significant challenges during evacuations and enabling fires to rapidly ascend to upper levels, resulting in extensive damage. It is imperative that Mahavitran addresses this issue with utmost seriousness to prevent further tragedies.

My Ganesha - Eco-Friendly Ganesha

The month of Shravan opens the floodgates of festivals. After celebrating Raksha Bandhan and Dahi Handi, the citizens are desperately awaiting Ganeshotsav, the most beloved festival of all. When the country goes into a festive mood for not one or two days but for a non-stop 10 days, people enjoy the festival with pomp and spectacle. Ganeshotsav is the most sacred and divine festival; however, while celebrating the Ganesh Festival, people generally ignore the environmental impact of pollution on air, water, noise, solid waste, etc. caused by various activities performed in puja. It is laudable that in recent years, we have seen increased awareness about water pollution caused by PoP Ganesh idols during Visarjan, i.e., immersion of Ganesh idols in water bodies. It takes several months to totally dissolve Ganesh idols made of PoP into water. Also, colours used in the decoration of idols contain harmful chemicals containing mercury and lead, which leak into the water as the idol dissolves. It increases acid content, total dissolved solids (TDS), and heavy metals in water. It kills aquatic plants and marine life, damaging the underwater ecosystem.

Along with Ganesh idols, people dump other accessories used in the worship of Ganapati, such as flowers, fruits, coconuts, incense, camphor, cloth, plastic, Thermocol, etc. It is collectively called Nirmalya. These commodities add to the level of water pollution. Every year, the government spends crores of rupees to clean and dig out tonnes of garbage from natural water sources.

People should avoid using such decorative materials that harm the environment. People have to make up their minds and stop purchasing decorative materials that are hazardous to the environment, and if people stop buying such decorative materials, then automatically the market will be compelled to stop selling such destructive materials in the market. Therefore, this responsibility belongs to the public.

Devotees celebrate the prestigious festival with all possible means, including loud music and massive speakers. During Anant Chaturdashi, which is the final day of the auspicious Ganesh festival, we witness heavy traffic on the roads, which leads to an increase in air (particles from vehicles) and noise (excessive honking) pollution. All the above points add up and increase noise pollution way beyond the permissible levels of 55 bB (day) and 45 dB (night) stated by the pollution control board. Senior citizens and children are directly affected by these, as in certain cases the noise level can even reach 110 dB.

A few Ganesha devotees in Mulund have taken the right initiative to celebrate eco-friendly Ganpati and eventually distribute them to the needy. Others should also follow it. Let us protect the

environment by beginning to celebrate Meri Ganapati, Environment Protection Ganapati.

Kanjur Traffic Police celebrate World Clean Air Day

Creates an awareness drive about clean air for rickshaw pullers and Govinda teams

The effect of global warming is fast ruining the climate, and it is high time the local, national, regional, and global partnerships come together to tackle the grave problem. To promote awareness about the protection of the environment, September 7 is celebrated as World Clean Air Day. On this

day, public awareness programmes are organised all over the world to create awareness and keep the environment clean. The Kanjurmarg Police on the day took the initiative, and the traffic police came on the road to educate rickshaw drivers and the Govinda teams about the prevention of air pollution.

On the occasion of Gokulashtami on September 7, a joint meeting of 25 Govinda squads and rickshaw pullers was organised by Kanjurmarg Traffic Police Station to explain the importance of World Clean Air Day. On the occasion, Police Inspector Sampat Londhe, in charge of Kanjur Traffic Police Division, PSI Pawar, and other traffic police officers guided the citizens. The traffic police also gave suggestions and information.

Police Inspector Sampat Londhe, in charge of the Kanjurmarg Traffic Police Division, said, "Everyone has a part to play in cleaning our air

and protecting our health. If everyone pledges to keep a clean environment then everyone can benefit from a safe, clean, healthy, and sustainable environment. He added, "Road vehicles emit a large amount of carbon dioxide into the air. Many motorists do not switch off their engines without stopping their vehicles during traffic jams and when signals are on. At that time, a large amount of carbon is emitted."

Sampat Londhe further advised auto drivers

and motorists, "Switch off the engine of your vehicle while stopping at the signal and keep the PUC checked from time to time. Motorists should also take care that their vehicle does not emit more carbon than the limit, and citizens should also follow the traffic rules so that there is no traffic jam. If there is no traffic jam, then there will be no carbon emissions in the air and the environment will be clean and we can breathe healthy air."

Post CM rebuke BMC begins cleanliness drive

Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde is in action mode, particularly for two reasons. Viz: Win the BMC election expected after the monsoon and save his 'Kursi' from the jaws of NCP leader Ajit Pawar's apparent ambition to become the chief minister. In a recent move that has increased his popularity among Mumbaikars, CM Eknath Shinde has expressed anger over the unhygienic main roads and sanitation in the narrow lanes and internal roads of the city.

Pulling up the BMC commissioner, Iqbal Singh Chahal, over the dirty roads of the city, Eknath Shinde wrote in a statement to I.S. Chahal, "Mr. Commissioner, the city main roads and the internal alleys are unclean. Cleanliness, not only on the main roads but also in alleys, is equally important. Uncleanliness will not be tolerated in Mumbai, and the solid waste management department should take this warning seriously."

According to reports, Eknath Shinde

was returning from a private function at Mazgaon Dock when he looked outside his moving car and was left amazed to witness garbage lying on the roadside. Peeved at the pathetic plight of the city, Shinde reportedly immediately called BMC Commissioner Chahal and ordered him to clean the main roads and alleys across Mumbai and maintain cleanliness in Mumbai.

After the Chief Minister's condemnation, BMC Commissioner Chahal swung into action. He immediately transferred seven officers of E-Ward, including Assistant Commissioner of E-Ward Ajay Kumar Yadav, Vikas Samant, Milind Joshi, Jaywant Parhar, etc., for their slack approach to duty and unclean roads under their charge.

Besides transferring the negligent officers, the civic chief ordered the BMC cleaning department that everyone, from assistant commissioners, ward officers, and sanitation inspectors to sanitation workers of the municipal corporation, must be involved in the cleanliness drive so the city should be clean and no clutter, garbage, or debris

should be visible on Mumbai roads.

BMC T-Ward in Action Mode After the CM order and the subsequent action by BMC Chief Chahal, every BMC Ward assistant commissioner is in action mode, including the T-Ward in Mulund. The T-Ward Solid Waste Management (SWM) department is cleaning the streets, and special attention is being given to the disposal of garbage. Unlike in the past, piles of garbage are not accumulated on the road but are disposed of at dumping grounds. Apart from the sanitation work, the cleaning staff is also ensuring the beautification work undertaken at designated spots across the Mulund.

An appeal

The BMC T-Ward has appealed to Mulundkars that if they witness garbage anywhere on the streets of Mulund, they should immediately call the Mulund BMC T-Ward Solid Waste Management (SWM) department and get the place cleaned immediately.



Disturbance Erupts at Gautami Patil's Mulund Event

However, as the event unfolded, a disruptive young man from the crowd managed to approach the stage and engaged in inappropriate behaviour towards a woman. Appalled by his actions, vigilant

onlookers swiftly intervened, ensuring he faced the consequences of his misconduct. Some members of the Govinda team also took action, briefly causing a commotion at the event. This unforeseen incident triggered a rapid response from the police, resulting in some initial confusion in the area. Event organizers made announcements in an attempt to regain control and pacify the crowd.

Following the altercation, the Mulund police have launched an investigation to identify those involved in the disruption during the event.

Gas Pipeline Rupture Disrupts Service to Mulund and Thane Residents

A tense situation unfolded in the MT Aggarwal Hospital area of Mulund West as a Mahanagar gas pipeline experienced a rupture. This incident transpired one Thursday morning, stirring apprehension among local residents. Preliminary findings suggested that the pipeline breach was linked to a subsiding portion of the hospital's grounds.

Further details emerged as the fire brigade received reports of a pervasive gas odour around the vicinity of MT Aggarwal Hospital in Mulund. Promptly responding to the alert, firefighters discovered a gas leak originating from an underground segment of the Mahanagar gas pipeline. This rupture resulted in the escape of PNG (domestic) gas. In the interest of public safety, Mahanagar Gas employees acted swiftly to curtail the gas supply to the affected area. Consequently, residents in Mulund East, Mulund West, and Kopri found themselves without access to cooking gas for several

hours

Nevertheless, the dedicated gas workers sprang into action, promptly rectifying the damaged gas line. Within a brief span, normal gas supply was restored. This positive outcome was achieved thanks to the prompt response of the fire brigade and the swift arrival of Mahanagar Gas personnel at the scene. Their collaborative efforts successfully averted a more extensive disaster and ensured the timely resumption of gas services.

The default owner of 'Sealed Flat' assaults bank security guards; arrested!

Two men guarding the house sealed by the bank were assaulted by the owner of the house. The incident took place at the Sai Classic Society near Chintamani Park in Mulund East. The police have registered a case against the assaulting landlord who has been arrested for the crime.

According to the police, the accused, Rajesh Pawaskar, owns

a house in Sai Classic Society, located on Babanrao Kulkarni Marg Mulund East. Pawaskar had taken a home loan from Kotak Mahindra Bank but failed to pay the interest; hence, the bank sealed his flat on account of his default on the loan. To recover the loan, the bank sealed the flat and appointed two security guards, Sumit Kumar Kashyap, and Rajvardhan Singh, to guard it.

On August 5, 2023, in the night at around 1:00 a.m., Rajesh Pawaskar came to the house but was stopped by the security guards. However, Pawaskar used muscle power to seek entry into the house. He abused and assaulted the bank security guards. To save their lives, the two security guards rushed out of the building. Meanwhile, they sighted the patrolling policemen

on the road. They approached the police and reported the matter.

The police went to the building and took Pawaskar into custody. Incidentally, Pawaskar was consuming alcohol. The police registered a case against him under Sections 323, 504, and 85(1) of the Maharashtra Liquor Act and arrested him. Navghar police are conducting a further investigation.

YOUTH HELD FOR CAR BATTERY THEFTS

The Mulund police have arrested a 22-year-old youth suspected of being a thief involved in stealing car batteries. Though the youth has not confessed his crime, but the police are confident. According to a senior Mulund police officer, "A few days

RTO warns citizens to be vigilant of fake e-Challan

After the electricity bill scam, the cyber fraudsters are now scamming citizens by sending links to e-challans, creating replicas of government websites, and duping Mumbaikar's hard-earned money. Amid increasing cases of e-challan scanning, the Regional Transport Department (RTO) police have issued a warning to Mumbaikars to be vigilant of such scams and not fall prey to the cyber thugs. The RTO is also using social media to spread awareness about the

ongoing fake e-challan scam. The cyber police have also appealed to citizens to avoid paying through any links received on mobile According to the police, in the past few weeks, cases of e-challans sent on mobile phones and cheating of citizens by sending fake messages have become common. A senior RTO officer said, "The modus operandi is simple. The cyber thugs send an alert SMS to their victims by affixing the traffic police logo, urging them to pay the outstanding amount. Besides, a dummy link is also sent to citizens'

mobile phones for payment. On clicking the link, the hackers get an access to the victim's bank account, and within seconds, money is diverted into the accounts of the cyber thugs! "To avoid being conned by the cyber thugs, Mumbaikars must remember that to curb the increasing incidence of fake messages, the RTO sends a message to the citizens from the official website of the traffic police to pay the challan. So don't trust any fake link message and pay the amount only on the official website of the RTO," he asserted.

Recovery of Lost and Stolen Mobile Phones Brings Relief to Mulund Residents

Parked vehicle burgled in Mulund

Peeved at the car being looted in broad daylight, Sagar Kale reported the matter to Mulund police. The Mulund police have registered a case under Section 379 of the IPC, and further investigation is on.

A SPEEDING BIKER KNOCKS DOWN A MULUND WOMAN! RASH DRIVER ARRESTED

In a tragic incident, a Mulund East lady on her bike was brutally banged from behind by a 20-year-old delivery boy and died in a road accident. The pedestrians caught hold of the rash bike driver and handed him to the Navghar Police. Mumbaikars' have demanded strict action from the administration due to the increasing accidents caused by speeding and careless delivery boys on the roads of Mumbai.

According to Navghar Police, on September 3, Junita Desai, a resident of Anand Nagar in

Interestingly, before the rash biker driver, identified as Nilesh Pednekar (20), a delivery boy, could escape from the scene, he was apprehended by the pedestrians on the road. The Navghar Police have registered a rash driving case against Pednekar under Sections 279 and 338 of the IPC and Sections 181 and 184 of the Motor Vehicle Act. Disappointed

at the increasing accidents on the road by the delivery boys, a senior citizen said, "The delivery boys are generally notorious for driving at high speeds to swiftly reach their destination and deliver their product as soon as possible. However, in their haste to achieve their delivery targets, these bikers accidentally knock into other bikers or motorists and injure others. Regrettably, in many cases, many delivery boys become targets of road accidents themselves. The government must set guidelines and penalise such delivery boy drivers for driving fast on roads."

ACCUSED ABSCONDING-POST PHYSICAL ASSAULT ON 11-YEAR-OLD

However, to her pleasant surprise, a few days ago she received a call from an unknown number, and a lady named Sita offered her an easy job by subscribing to a YouTube

channel. She was given a link to join a Telegram group for work. The lady, in excitement, clicked the link without checking the authenticity of the link. The lady thus got registered and started doing small tasks and earning easy money.

After giving her initial tasks and winning confidence that the company was genuine, the company enticed her to do paid tasks and lured her to earn huge money. The lady started doing the tasks, but to her surprise, instead of getting prize money, Rs. 1 lakh and Rs. 53,750 were withdrawn from her bank

account. Realising her folly, she complained to Mulund Police Station. The police have registered a case under sections 419 and 420 of the IPC and the IT Act.

An Appeal

In an appeal to the citizens, the Mumbai police have been repeatedly enlightening people that workfrom-home is a big scam. Initially, the company paid huge amounts into the bank accounts of the people. Due to this, most citizens trust and deposit a huge amount, only to later pay a huge price for their greed.


