MC's Clean Air Crusal

In the past few months, the air quality Mumbai has been consistently worsening despite the city's civic body, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), adopting various measures to control pollution. To seek a permanent solution to the rapidly increasing pollution in the city, BMC Commissioner and Municipal Administrator Iqbal Singh Chahal chaired a joint meeting with government and private institutions and organizations related to the construction sector and framed guidelines to control air pollution in the city. Interestingly, along with BMC tightening the screws to stop pollution, Guardian Minister Deepak Kesarkar has also emphasized the need to control air pollution within two months in the city.

During the meeting, the construction activities in the city (both the private real estate and the government infrastructure project sites) were considered a key component in worsening the air pollution in the city. Hence, the BMC has given the developers a 15-day window to procure and deploy apparatus on their sites to tackle the deteriorating Mumbai air quality. In addition, the BMC has introduced detailed 27-point



guidelines to address the rising menace of deteriorating air pollution and smog covering the city. According to the guidelines issued on Monday (October 23), a special team has been formed in 24 wards of the city. Two teams have been formed in small wards. four teams in middle wards, and six teams in big wards. Assistant Commissioners of each ward will be in charge of the team.

Informing about the team, the AMC of T-Ward told, "The team will consist of two ward engineers, one policeman, one marshal, and one vehicle. This team will independently conduct a surprise inspection of the ongoing construction site in the ward and make a video of the sites violating the

BMC guidelines. Besides, builders who violate the rules without notice will be issued a "Work Stop" order. Their construction activity will be sealed.

To stop the pollution generated from the construction site, the BMC has directed developers to install a water sprinkler system and a smoke gun system. The builders have been given a time zone of 15 days and 30 days to install the water sprinkler system and the smoke gun system, respectively.

Assistant Commissioners will deploy special teams in their respective wards to take action against those who throw debris illegally, and if the vehicle Contd. on page 6

FIRE PREVENTION MEASUR

After the massive fire at the Jay Bhavani SRA building in Unnat Nagar in Goregaon on October 6, in which eight people died and numerous others were injured, the committee instituted to investigate the fire accident submitted its report on Monday to BMC chief Iabal Chahal.

The committee advised 15 measures to prevent such fires in SRA buildings in the future.

Among the key suggestions, the committee suggested increasing the current three-year liability period to 10 years in the case of SRA buildings. It is also recommended that the new SRA building have enough passages on each floor and more than one staircase, with each staircase wider than 2 meters. The staircase must be made of steel.

The committee also suggested conducting a regular fire audit of SRA buildings in June every year and issuing the occupancy certificate to newly constructed SRA buildings. The chief fire officer should first issue a completion certificate for fire safety equipment and firefighting measures.

Informing me about the report, a senior BMC officer said, "There has been a record increase in the number of fire accidents in Mumbai. As a result, residents

lose their lives, and property is damaged. Hence, after the fire in the SRA building in Goregaon, the civic administration came into alert mode. To seek a concrete solution to curb these fire accidents, BMC formed a committee, which has submitted its report. We have received the report. The report is currently being studied, and soon the remedial plans as per the report will be implemented," he added.

FDA Cracks Down on Festive Snack Adulteration

Each year, during the festive season, the media is flooded with reports of hundreds of people getting sick due to eating festival sweets. However, the

Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is on high alert. It has formed 13 special teams to crack down on shopkeepers who adulterate sweets. In addition, the FDA has also announced that shopkeepers who do not

mention the manufacturing and expiration dates on loose sweets will be punished.

The festive season has begun, and so has the demand for sweets across India. However, it is tragic that to meet the massive demand for sweets, the corrupt and fraudulent shopkeepers use cheap, quality ingredients to mint money. This adulterated food is risky as it is toxic and can



severely affect health. The worst part is that some adulterated foods even cause various lifethreatening diseases. To prevent the trading of adulterated food in the market, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has been operating more actively during these festive times of Diwali. This year, to they are keeping a hawk-eye on adulterated food, the FDA has constituted 13 special teams to curb the menace of food adulteration.

Shailesh Adhao, Joint Commissioner (Food), FDA. told the media, "We have undertaken a stringent drive substandard against and adulterated food materials, especially sweets, edible oil, Namkeen, Mawa, and khova, as the Diwali festival is around the corner. Moreover, if anyone is caught selling adulterated, impure, or substandard edible goods, he would face strict action under the provisions of the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI)."

He added, "Besides, shopkeepers selling food without mentioning the expiration date on packed products or loose sweets kept in trays and containers will also face punishment. If any food samples are found to be insecure and detrimental to health, imprisonment of up to 3 months and a fine will be charged. And if it is found below the standard, the adjudicating officer can charge a fine of Rs 2 to 5 lakhs."

The FDA commissioner has directed his officers to take strict action and suspend the licenses of those violating the law. Meanwhile, the FDA has also appealed to manufacturers and traders to use quality ingredients for sweets and namkeen items for sale during the festival season.

Businesses dealing in food products need to keep the

quality better.

It has been ordered to keep adulterated raw materials, especially milk products, at the right temperature.

Special attention must be paid to the quality of the oil for frying.

Shop managers also have to be careful while selling sweets in the open because keeping sweets in the open can pose a risk to food safety.

More emphasis should be laid on checking the adulteration of raw materials for milk and products, especially milk and milk products.

Customers should also be careful while buying khoya, paneer, and ghee. They should buy only good-quality materials and keep away from adulterated materials.

Shopkeepers have been instructed to purchase milk, khoya, ghee, paneer, etc. only from licensed sellers registered with FSSAI.



Mulund Radiates Festive Joy During Navratri

EXTREME FINANCIAL FIX: FAKE ROBBERY STAGED TO CLEAR DEBTS

A complex plan devised by an employee to escape his financial troubles ended up backfiring, ultimately coming apart thanks to the vigilant law enforcement.

In the neighbourhood of Mulund East, an unsettling trend had emerged, where some individuals were attempting to ease their financial burdens by misappropriating their employer's money.

One of those involved was Rahul Butak, an employee working for a chocolate business owner in Crawford Market, Mumbai. Rahul's job involved the collection and deposit of payments at his employer's residence in Mulund.

On October 21, Rahul executed a scheme with significant consequences. He gathered a sum of Rs 160,000, originally intended for his employer, and set off on his usual

delivery route. However, he never reached his destination. intended merchant Later, the made a distressing call to Rahul's wife, alleging that her husband had been accosted by four assailants on Nahur Road in the Cement Yard area. These supposed criminals brandished a knife, made off with the money, and disappeared.

Upon receiving the merchant's report, the police were alerted, and

they commenced an inquiry with Rahul about the incident. As they probed deeper, they began to notice inconsistencies in Rahul's account, raising suspicions. Consequently, the police initiated a counter-investigation.

Under the relentless scrutiny of the police, Rahul eventually broke. He confessed to the authorities, disclosing the actual nature of the incident. He admitted

to fabricating the entire robbery narrative in a desperate effort to alleviate his financial difficulties and debts.

With the truth now exposed, the police seized the misappropriated funds, filed charges against Rahul, and subsequently took him into custody. The authorities are currently pursuing an ongoing investigation into this intricate web of deceit.

Combating Pollution: Seeking Solutions

The rapidly increasing deterioration in air quality in Mumbai is becoming a reason to worry. Just like Delhi, Mumbai is becoming hazardous for people suffering from respiratory diseases and infants. The air quality in Mumbai has deteriorated considerably, making the air worse than in Delhi. According to the System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research (SAFAR), with an Air Quality Index (AQI) of 181, Mumbai witnessed the most polluted air on October 24. But this is not a surprise. Over the past three to four years, every October, Mumbai's air quality has been deteriorating at an increasing pace.

According to the Executive Director of Research and Advocacy, Centre for Science and Environment, earlier, there was satisfaction in Mumbai that the sea breeze would blow the pollution away since it's a coastal city. But the data recently has been showing otherwise. As pollution in Mumbai makes headlines and the sinking air quality of Mumbai degrades, there is an urgent need to act fast before things get worse.

On pondering the reason for the downfall of air quality in Mumbai, environmental experts blame construction activities as the primary cause of poor air quality in the financial capital of Mumbai. In the mad race of development, the new ideology of the re-development of the Mumbai cluster into skyscrapers has polluted the air beyond healing. To add salt to injury, the construction of the metro trains has made matters more horrifying. As per sources, more than 6 thousand construction works are going on in Mumbai. Apart from construction, there are refineries, power plants, and chemical plants in Mumbai, which are all substantial sources of air pollution. What is pitiable is that in the development race, Mumbaikars have sacrificed the green lungs, mountains, and mangroves, which are the saving grace to balance the ecosystem.

The increasing air pollution is becoming a hazard for children and adults, as they are facing health problems due to long-term exposure to air pollutants. Exposure to high levels of pollution reduces lung function, increases respiratory infections, and aggravates asthma. Long-term or chronic exposure to fine particulate matter increases a person's risk for diseases like stroke, heart disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, and cancer. Hence, with air pollution becoming a lifethreatening issue, Mumbaikars must change their lifestyle. It is high time Mumbaikars stop their luxurious lifestyle and start using public transport. Especially e-mobility (electric vehicles, hybrid vehicles, and CNG vehicles for public transport services) and the use of public transport as needed. Use new systems and technologies, such as air quality monitoring systems, etc. Promote greenery within the city. Citizens should manage waste properly, including zero-waste schemes, and reduce pollution. Use a

mask where there is more pollution. In a nutshell, beware of the increasing air pollution.

throwing construction material or debris does not comply with these rules, the vehicle will be sealed. Construction sites exceeding one acre must maintain a 35-foot barricade. while those under one acre should have a 25-foot barricade. Further, green cloth or jute sheet coverings should be deployed at construction sites, regardless of the construction stage. The BMC has said any uncovered building under construction will face a stop-work notice from the BMC.

The tires of all vehicles must be compulsorily cleaned to remove dust before leaving the construction sites and before plying on the road. BMC can directly issue a stop-work notice if any site, (government or private) is found negligent in complying with pollutionrelated regulations. Along with this, many other guidelines have also been issued by the Municipal Corporation for the under-construction site.

All the guidelines are to be followed by other agencies, including the SRA, MHADA, MIDC, MSRDC, MMRDA, BPT, Airport Authority of India, Railways, government or semigovernment authorities, and private construction sites.

MULUND FOB WORK IN PROGRESS

Mulund East and West Foot Over Bridge repair work is now in progress, with restricted access to the bridge. The railway administration has taken action to address the deteriorating condition of this vital bridge in response to public demands for swift repairs. The restoration project began on October 20 after successful advocacy for its rehabilitation.

This foot bridge, over connecting the east and west sides near Mulund railway consistently station. has made headlines due to safety concerns. It was identified as a potential hazard during a bridge audit conducted after the Paral bridge accident. Despite temporary repairs, the bridge's condition continued to worsen.



Consequently, the railway administration has launched a comprehensive repair program for the bridge, which has been off-limits to the public since October 20.

The bridge is currently restricted, and individuals are not allowed to enter the area. It is expected that the repairs will

be completed in time for Diwali, at which point the bridge will be reopened for railway commuters.

GUARDIAN MINISTER VOWS TO MAKE MUMBAI BANNER-FREE

Despite court orders prohibiting illegal banners and hoardings in public places, the civic authorities have failed to crack the whip on violators who time and again putup political posters and deface the city. The crime rate in Mulund is increasing, and the situation has worsened so much that burglars are daringly looting houses and shops by breaking the front door. A few days ago, burglars looted a

house in broad daylight and entered the house by breaking the front lock. Recently, in a shocking theft case, a culprit broke the grill of a jewellery shop in Mulund West and escaped with booty worth Rs 8 lakh!

According to Mulund Police, on October 25, Ramesh Jain (48), a resident of Mulund and owner of a gold jewellery shop on JN Road in Mulund West, closed his shop at 9 p.m. as usual and went home.

However, to his utter shock, the next day, when Ramesh Jain opened his shop, he was startled to observe that the grill of the shop was broken and gold jewellery worth Rs 8 lakh was stolen. Jain immediately went to




