# Post increase in toll rates, MNS holds protests in Mulund

The Maharashtra Navanirman Sena (MNS) staged an agitation on Saturday against the increase in toll plaza rates at Anand Nagar Toll Naka at the Eastern Express Highway in Mulund East. The members of the MNS party took to the roads in Mulund and Thane with placards in hand and demanded a reduction in the toll charges scheduled to increase on October 1. The MNS workers warned that if the toll rates are not reduced, then the party will conduct a 'bitter' protest.

The protest had continued for two continuous days. On day one, i.e., October 1, 2023, the MNS protests formed a human chain blocking more than 4 kilometers of the Eastern Express Highway. The protestors held a peaceful protest, carrying the party flags and banners in their hands and raising slogans against the growing inflation. A large number of MNS workers and women workers participated in this movement.

On day two, i.e., October 2, on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, MNS workers adopted the Gandhigiri style of protest. The protestors dressed in the guise of Mahatma Gandhi came on the road and motivated citizens to raise their voices against the mounting toll prices. A member of the MNS told HOME TIMES, "We have adopted peaceful measures to register our protest against the 'unjust' increase of the toll rates. However, if the government gives a deaf ear to our protest, then let me warn the government that in the coming days, MNS will conduct a 'bitter' protest in the trademark MNS style."

### In a single year CNG/PNG rate slashed for the third time!

In a huge relief to the common man; amidst growing inflation and increasing prices of every commodity, CNG and PNG prices have been slashed once again after the Centre revised domestically produced natural gas prices. This is the third consecutive drop in the price. Earlier rates were dropped in April and February.

The price of CNG has been dropped by ₹3 per kilogram, while the price of PNG has been reduced by ₹2 per Standard Cubic Meter (SCM). After the change, the new price of CNG is 76 per kg and the domestic PNG price is 47 rupees. The new rates are effective from October 1.

Rates of CNG and PNG are revised on April 1 and October 1 each year, particularly for newer fields situated in challengingto-access areas like deep-sea locations. The price drop is possible because the price of gas from deep-sea and highpressure, high-temperature (HPTP) areas has been reduced to USD 9.96 per million British



thermal units (mmBtu) from USD 12.12, as reported by the oil ministry's Petroleum Planning and Analysis Cell (PPAC).

This year, on April 7, the price of CNG was reduced by Rs. 8 per kg, and the price of domestic PNG was reduced by Rs. 5. Further, the price of CNG was reduced by Rs 2.5 in February. This is the third consecutive drop in the price.

### High-Tech Water Closets to come up on Railway stations

With Prime Minister Narendra Modi boosting the Nari Shakti, the Central Railway (CR) Mumbai Division has even joined hands to empower women by introducing hygienic, hi-tech, and upgraded washrooms at seven prominent railway stations, including Mulund in Mumbai. The washroom is rechristened WOLOO (Women's Loo) or Powder Room, as mentioned in Western culture.

Powder Rooms will have all the modern facilities of a five-star hotel, offering a superior-class hygienic environment equipped with toilets, washbasins, mirrors, and makeup items. In short, refreshment zone where the ladies can freshen up at affordable rates. The powder rooms will start within two months!

Senior DCM of Mumbai Division Robin Kalia, informing about the initiative, said, "The powder rooms will have four toilets, which will cover half the area. Apart from refreshing, these powder rooms will also have licensed retail shops selling women's hygiene products, beauty products, personal care products, cosmetics, gift items, etc., at the marginal retail price (MRP)."

Powder rooms will initially be installed at LTT, Ghatkopar, Kanjurmarg, Mulund, Thane, Mankhurd, and Chembur stations.

Female passengers need to pay Rs 10 for availing of the facility. Office-going ladies can buy pass facilities for just Rs 365

(annual). Digital payment facilities are also available.

The powder rooms will be managed by decent, well-dressed, polite staff with valid identity cards, and each powder room will have a cleaning staff to maintain 100 percent hygiene, as is available at airports and five-star hotels. Senior DCM of Mumbai Division Robin Kalia said, "We have already marked the construction site of the Powder Room at the specified seven stations. The work and cost of erecting the structure are borne by the contractors, who will win a 5-year contract to run the project. In return, Central Railway is expected to fetch revenue of ₹39.48 lakh per annum for 5 years from the licensee looking after the Powder Room."

# Hawker Politics: The Root of the Perpetual Problem

Following the tragic stampede at the Elphinstone Road station's foot-over bridge (FOB), in which 23 people died, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) began sporadic action at many places against the hawker's menace. The court even ordered the removal of hawkers from the 150-meter zone from the railway stations. BMC did a crackdown on hawkers who disrupted the movement of commuters on the FOB and station premises. However, these actions are temporary and pop up when an accident occurs, or the BMC gets a whip from the Mumbai High Court.

In short, the problem of hawkers in Mumbai has become a sore eye. Though the BMC has made laws, even BMC officials are authorized to punish illegal hawkers and penalize those caught red-handed hawking on the road. But the action is an eyewash, and the laws are feeble. A hawker caught hawking in the morning can be seen back in business in the evening on the same spot.

Mulund's RRT Road is infamous for illegal hawking. It is the BMC's responsibility to take action against these illegal hawkers, but since 2019, Mulund T ward has not taken any stringent action against illegal hawkers. When countered to curb illegal hawking, T-Ward has many reasons to tighten the critics' lips. First Corona, then the issue of lack of manpower or the visit of a VIP; thus, T-Ward wards off action against the illegal hawkers.

Due to leniency in the action against illegal hawkers, the hawkers' authority gathers momentum, and they become stronger. This gives them the advantage to encroach; as a result, since 2019, the illegal encroachment on RRT roads has been swelling. Apart from the illegal hawker's encroachment, the BEST bus also run on the same road. Due to this, there is no space left for pedestrians to walk on the road. The hawkers on the footpath, the adjacent roads, and the bus in the middle of the road are making life miserable for Mulundkars to walk on the road.

Apart from RRT, a similar scene is visible on Mulund's many prominent roads, like VP Road, Devi Dayal Road, MG Road, and J.S. Dosa Road.

The hawkers' problem can be solved if the BMC follows the Supreme Court order and implements the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act and gives legalized space to hawkers, but the multimilliondollar question is: What about the officers who let the hawkers or encroachment come in the first place? Why is no action being taken against them? What about the politicians who protect such illegal activities by pressuring the administration not to take action in such cases? Until the politics over hawkers is rooted

out, the problem will continue!!!



# Heavy rainfall alleviates water scarcity concerns

Water scarcity fears have been alleviated due to the return of heavy rainfall, bolstering the reservoirs. In recent days, substantial rain has replenished all seven lakes that provide water to Mumbai, significantly the chances reducing of water shortages until the next monsoon. A yellow rain alert has been issued for Mumbai and adjacent districts for the next four days, anticipating more rain in the lake catchment areas.

Mumbai and its surrounding areas rely on water sourced from

Traditionally, Mumbai experiences the onset of monsoon in June; however, this year saw. rainfall in the ensuing months, cities and suburbs faced the risk of severe water shortages. To proactively address this, a 10 percent water reduction was initiated from July 1. Fortunately, adequate rainfall was received in July and August, resulting in the lakes reaching their maximum water storage levels. Consequently, the threat of water shortages until the next monsoon has significantly diminished.

seven lakes: Upper Vaitrana, Modak Sagar, Tansa, Middle Vaitrana, Bhatsa, Vihar, and Tulsi. The primary water sources are Modak Sagar, Tansa, Middle Vaitrana, Upper Vaitrana, and Bhatsa lakes. As of October 1, the combined water storage across these lakes stood at 99.18 percent, reflecting a 0.61 percent increase from the previous year, alleviating concerns about water scarcity until the next monsoon. In the same period last year, by the final week of September, water storage levels were at 95 percent, leading to the decision to not enforce water reduction measures until this year's monsoon. However, due to the delayed onset of the monsoon this year, a precautionary 10 percent water cut was implemented. The substantial rainfall this year has replenished the lakes, eliminating the need for a water cut.

## NCP activists held ahead of the planned protest

In the evening in Mulund, a protest was staged in the vicinity of the railway station under the leadership of Taluka President Amit Patil from the Nationalist Congress Party {Sharad Pawar} Furthermore, NCP activist Gurujotsinkir from Mulund was apprehended at his residence immediately after announcing intentions to halt train services. As the day progressed, the police continued to detain protestors. The government's inability to provide adequate

medical facilities in government hospitals is resulting in the loss of innocent lives. As a result, NCP activists are calling for the government to acknowledge its failures and step down. During this event, spirited slogans were raised against the government, leading to a significant deployment of police forces in the Mulund railway station area.

## **Mobile thefts on surge in Mulund**

Mulundkars Beware! Take care of your mobile phones, as there is a steady surge in the theft of mobile phones in Mulund. According to Mulund police, in a single month, more than 22 cases of mobile thefts have been registered. What is more disgraceful is that during the Ganesh Utsav, the thefts of mobiles have been the maximum; almost 50 percent of mobiles were stolen during the Ganesh Utsav. Alarmed by the increase in mobile theft cases, the Mulund police have cautioned people to be vigilant and take proper care of their mobile phones.

After gold chains, the burglars have shifted their focus to mobiles, as mobile phones

are as expensive as gold. Senior Police Inspector Kantilal Kothimbare told HOME TIMES, "As per the statistics, 22 mobile theft cases have been reported in Mulund West from September 1 to September 30. Of the 22 theft cases, the Mulund police have been able to arrest just four accused. What is distressing is that most of the mobiles have been stolen during the Ganesh Utsav."

Cautioning the people to be vigilant during the upcoming festival season, Kantilal Kothimbire said, "During festivals, the chances of theft are higher due to the rush. Anti-social elements mingle with the common citizens and escape stealing valuables like purses, gold chains, and mobile phones. With the onset of festival seasons like Dussehra and Navratri to start in a few days, Mulund Police has appealed to the citizens to be careful and protect their valuables."

### Methods to be vigilant during festivals

A) Keep checking your valuables at regular intervals.

B) Avoid unnecessary conversations with strangers.

C) Never remove your jewellery on the insistence of a stranger and keep it in a handkerchief or a bag on the street.

D) While visiting crowded areas, keep an eye on the activities around you, and if possible, keep a close guard on your mobiles and other valuables.

# **Mulund to get Rs 36 crore Olympic-style ground by 2025**

With Indian athletes amassing heap of medals at the Asian Games 2023, the sports ministry is playing better stadiums in India to encourage budding athletes. As a first step, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has ambitious plans to develop the city's inaugural Olympicstandard stadium in Mumbai. In the proposed stadium slated to open in 2025, the civic body said the project, estimated to cost Rs 36 crore, will come up on a 24,682 square-meter land parcel near Kalidas Natyagruh in Mulund West.

Kishore Gandhi, Deputy Municipal Commissioner (Gardens), said, "The stadium is one of the first kinds of international stadiums in Mumbai. The goal is to make a parallel stadium at par with Olympic standards, which

entails the engagement of specialized agencies for the construction of these worldclass sports facilities. It is being developed by the BMC." "The construction of the stadium will start in January 2024, and the project is targeted to be completed in 18 months. Besides, a modular grandstand with a seating capacity of more than 560 people is also to be developed," he added.

ABMC senior official added, "While it is too early to decide about the registration and fees, we may charge a nominal fee from those who want to avail of the facility. The stadium is for the public; hence, the fee will be such that it is suitable for the ordinary citizen." he added, "The benefits of which will now be available to the citizens and Olympic sports lovers living in Mulund and surrounding areas."

# **BMC begins the 'First QR Code Rabies campaign' in the city**

The dog menace in the city has been an age-old hazard; hence, to bring an end to the problem of roadside canines and make Mumbai rabiesfree, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation has launched a massive vaccination drive on Saturday to cover around 15,000 stray dogs in six city wards. The key highlight of the campaign is that it is a 'First QR Code Rabies campaign' that will apply the latest QR code to help the civic body provide details about the vaccination information status, about the feeder, and other relevant medical information.

Informing about the Rabies campaign, а senior BMC officer said, "The drive is organised at six municipal wards, i.e., R North (Dahisar), R Central (Borivali), South (Kandivali), R P North (Malad), S (Bhandup, Kanjurmarg), and T (Mulund) wards. More than 100 employees of BMC have been appointed for the work. Besides, the civic body has roped in 15 different NGOs as well as Mumbai Veterinary College to help in carrying out the drive. The drive started on Saturday, September 29, and will continue till October 10."

An official of the BMC T-Ward said, "The

campaign is a huge success; in the past six days, more than 8500 street dogs have been vaccinated for rabies across Mumbai, while in Mulund East and West, 1011 dogs and 358 cats have been vaccinated, totalling 1369 animals." QR code collar

The drive involves the implementation of vaccine doses and making the dogs wear a collar that will consist of OR codes. Once scanned, the QR codes will give details about the vaccination status, along with details of the feeder and other relevant medical information. the Besides, other importance of the QR

Code is that if a dog ever becomes a victim of an incident, then the code can be scanned and information can be given to the concerned feeder. Along with this, information about when the dog has been tested for rabies can also be obtained through that code.

Citizen laud the Rabies drive.

Lauding the QR Code Rabies drive, an animal enthusiast said, "Earlier in 2014, a dog census carried out by the civic body showed that there are around 95,000 stray dogs in Mumbai, and currently, in 2023, the estimated dog population is about 1,64,000. It is alarming because, on an average, Mumbai reports around 80,000 cases of dog bites, the highest in Maharashtra. Hence, the QR Code rabies drive will decrease the dog bite instances in the city.

"Later, the civic body is likely to take up the initiative in other parts of the city to vaccinate the stray canine population, estimated at over 1.50 lakh, "informed Kishore Gandhi.

Dr Kalimpasha Patha, said, "We have a target of 15,000 dogs, after the target is reached, we will evaluate the process and assess our performance before moving on to the next phase of vaccinating more dogs."

# **Minister Uday Samant graces Senior Painters Award Program in Mulund**

In response to their concerns, the Deputy Registrar's office has swiftly issued a circular to all societies, underscoring the importance of precautionary measures to mitigate such disputes.

The recent incident at Mulund's Shiv Sadan Society, where a Marathi woman was denied a position, exacerbated the situation. The woman took to social media to seek assistance from political figures regarding Marathi-related issues. The linguistic dispute has generated discontent among the general public as well. Industries Minister Uday Samant, along with BJP leaders Chitra Wagh and Prasad Lad, joined local MP Manoj Kotak and MLA Mihir Kotecha in expressing support for the woman. The onus of any discriminatory acts lies with the society office bearers. In the event of such incidents, these office bearers will face appropriate consequences. The Deputy Registrar's office has conveyed this directive to all housing societies. People's representatives are hopeful that these proactive measures will deter future incidents of a similar nature.

### Surge in pickpocketing in Mulund's Vegetable Market

The vegetable market in Mulund is witnessing a concerning rise in pickpocketing incidents, with a recent case involving the theft of a gold chain worth 70 thousand rupees from a woman's handbag. The RRT road in Mulund has become a hotspot for pickpocketing, particularly targeting shoppers purchasing vegetables in the area.

On October 3rd, a Mulund resident named

Pinky Joshi visited the market to get her three gold chains repaired. She entrusted two of the chains to jewellers for repairs and placed the third chain in her bag, which did not require any fixing. While shopping for vegetables on RRT Road, her son alerted her to the bag being tampered with from below.

Upon inspection, it was apparent that the bag had been discreetly cut open from the bottom, and the gold chain wallet inside was stolen. Despite a thorough search within the bag's compartments and the surrounding area, the chain remained elusive. The bag had been skilfully cut using a blade, suggesting a deliberate attempt to steal the wallet.

In the wake of this distressing incident, Pinky Joshi, accompanied by her husband, reported the theft to the Mulund police station two days later, formally filing a complaint.

# **Two Minors Go Missing in Mulund: Police Launch Investigation**

Concern has gripped Mulund as two underage boys have gone missing under mysterious circumstances, prompting a flurry of questions within community. the Did they leave voluntarily or were they taken against their will? This uncertainty has fuelled discussions, leading the Mulund police to launch a search for the missing minors.

The boys in question are Manthan, 16 years old, and

Soham, 14 years old, both residing in Mulund. They disappeared after expressing their intention to visit a store to retrieve a Casio device for their household. They had informed their family about their trip to shops near the railway station for this purpose. However, on October 3, they left home in the afternoon and did not return by 5:00 PM as expected. Concerned, their family reached out to a friend's residence, only to discover that the duo had

supposedly gone to CST to buy the Casio.

Subsequent attempts to contact them were futile, as they did not have mobile phones. The minors whereabouts remained unknown to their family members. By 8:00 PM, they had not returned home, prompting their family to wonder if they had sought refuge with neighbours or relatives in Pune. Despite investigating this possibility, no traces were found at the mentioned locations.

As worry grew, the families

visited the Mulund police around 10:30 PM, station filing a formal complaint and suspecting that the minors might have been abducted due to their prolonged absence. Recognizing the seriousness of the situation, the Mulund police swiftly took action, obtaining photographs of the missing minors and registering a case of kidnapping. They are currently conducting a thorough search to locate the minors and bring resolution to the case.

# **Crime Branch Zone VII seizes** 60 kg of Ganja in Mulund

The Mumbai Police Crime Branch Unit VII seized a massive 60 kg Ganja worth Rs. 24 lakh in Mulund in a major operation. The police have arrested four accused and seized the Ganja as well as the vehicle that was used to transport the Ganja Buldhana from into Mulund.

Spotting the car, the police approached it and began interrogation. However, the driver and his accompanists failed to give a satisfactory reply. Hence, the police began a search operation and discovered 60 kg of banned Ganja worth Rs 24 lakh in the market. The arrested accused

are identified as Mohsin Sheikh and Mohammad Khan, both Bhandup residents and two boys from Mulund, Rohit Bhalerao and Rakesh Gaikwad.

### **POLICE CRACKDOWN ON GANG DRUGGING AUTO DRIVERS WITH SPIKED DRINKS**

Mulund and Navghar police have jointly busted a gang that was robbing rickshaw drivers by offering cold drinks mixed with intoxicants. A 42-year-old accused, Sharad, from Kalvan, has been arrested. Meanwhile, two accused are still absconding.

# **Police efficiency lauded:** Lost gold ornaments recovered in just 2 hours

### NAHUR RESIDENT CHEATED OF RS 9 LAKH IN CRYPTOCURRENCY SCAM!

Cryptocurrencies have seen a boom in recent years. Companies Bitcoin have like grown from relatively unknown to a multitrillion-dollar market. Unfortunately, this has unlocked opportunities for scammers to take advantage of and capitalize on security weaknesses to initiate scams. These scams are simple: cybercriminals

attract gullible people to invest money in crypto assets and offer fake investments. A similar case of fake investment has been unearthed n Nahur.

According to Navghar Police, five years ago, a resident of Nahur, Ashfaq Khan (43), met Indrabhushan Chaudhary, a resident of Borivali East. The two became friends and used to discuss plans to increase money. Indrabhushan had experience in the trading of cryptocurrency and forex; hence, he would entice Ashfaq to invest in cryptocurrency as it offered a great chance of doubling money.

On June 10, Indrabhushan met Asfaq and, as usual, asked him to invest in cryptocurrency. He tempted Asfaq that if he intended to earn Rs 25,000 in just a week, he must invest Rs 1 lakh and promised that after a week it would increase to Rs 1.25 lakh. Excited by the easy method of growing money, Asfaq got carried away and invested Rs 2 lakh to earn Rs 50,000 in a single week.

In the company of Indrabhushan, Asfaq invested as much as Rs 9 lakh in cryptocurrency, hoping to make a massive profit of Rs 10 lakh or more in just a week. However, after more than 8 days, when Asfaq did not receive any money, he contacted Indrabhushan, he declined to talk to him.

Asfaq realized of being cheated, and reported the matter to the Navghar police. The Navghar police have registered a cheating case against the accused, Indrabhushan Chaudhary, under Section 420 of the IPC.
