MUMBAI'S WATER QUALITY WORSENS : APPEALS TO CITIZENS TO BOIL WATER BEFORE DRINKING!

Dear Mumbaiers Beware! Do not drink municipal water without boiling it. The BMC has appealed to the citizens to boil the water and drink it, as the purity of the water has declined considerably.

In 2019, the central government appointed the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) to check the quality of water across the major metropolitan cities in India. The BIS collected samples of water from the taps of municipal water connections

across India. The report submitted by BIS declared Mumbai city to have the cleanest water. The Mumbai water, as per the report, outperformed each of the 11 individual parameters of the tests conducted by BIS.

Guarding Joy: Ensuring Women's Safety

The festive season kicks off on October 15, 2023, with the famous 9-day Gujarati festival Navratri and concludes on October 23, with the Maa Durga Puja on the day of Mahanavami. It will be followed by Dussehra, celebrated on October 24 with the killing of demon King Ravana on Vijayadashami. Navratri is a festival of dance and music; hence, it is widely celebrated by the youth, irrespective of their caste and creed.

During Navratri, generally, the ladies come out in large numbers with colourful costumes, glittering ornaments, and fancy make-up. These ladies perform the traditional Garba dance around a centrally lit lamp or a picture or statue of the goddess Shakti to celebrate the annual Hindu festival observed in honour of the goddess Durga. However, it is regrettable that these Garba grounds have become a hunting ground to stalk and harass the women. Many mischief-mongers and pervert beasts lurk around these grounds with the sole intention of satisfying their sexual hunger. Hence, to curb these anti-social elements, the security of the ladies is a big challenge for the Mumbai police and society. According to the Mumbai police, special priority is attributed to women's security during the nine-day festival. The police beef up security, and cops in plain clothes are deployed at various Garba grounds to teach a bitter lesson to mischief-mongers and nab those who harass women. A Special police squad tackles the menace of sexual harassment. The squad does intensive patrolling in plain clothes near venues and mandals where garba and dandiya are held. Every year Mumbai police deploys extra policemen to patrol from various departments. The cops are headed by deputy commissioners of police, assistant police commissioners, police inspectors, sub-inspectors, assistant police inspectors, constables, home guards, and paramilitary forces. In addition, the Quick Response Team is also roped in to monitor the proceedings of the festive season.

Apart from the police, the boys also have a responsibility to protect their sisters from the hoodlums and perverts loitering around. It is good these days that college students come in groups and perform Dandiya. Hence, most of the girls find themselves in saving hands due to their male counterparts being their college colleagues. Navratri is a holy festival; hence, it is the duty of the police and society to ensure that the dignity of the festival is not tarnished by a handful of notorious anti-social elements. Hence, there is a need for change. The elders must explain the traditional customs and the glory of festivals to the children so that they feel proud of the festival. Elders should explain the significance of Dandiya and the nine forms of Maa Durga. If we instil in our coming generation the values of the festival, then this holy festival will continue its legacy for a hundred years!

From summer sizzle to October inferno: Mumbai is grappling with relentless heat

The global warming impact is becoming more evident in metropolitan cities like Mumbai, Delhi, and Bangalore. Mumbai, which witnessed the most horrifying summer seasons this year, is again gripped by the heat waves. The temperature in the suburbs has increased by about 3 degrees Celsius within a day. In an appeal by the civic health department, Mumbaiers are urged not to move out of the house without any reason. In an emergency, people are advised to move out with umbrellas, water bottles, or fruit juices, if necessary.

According to the Regional Meteorological Department, the maximum temperature of the suburb was 33 degrees on Sunday, while on Monday, the temperature was recorded above 35 degrees, and it is expected that the temperature will increase in the next 2 to 3 days.

Environmentalists claim the reason behind the rise in temperature is low winds coming from the east. In this situation, citizens need to stay hydrated.

Citizens have been encouraged to drink water from time to time and keep themselves hydrated due to the rising temperature in October. Not only that, it is advised not to leave the house without any reason and to take a hat or umbrella to avoid the sun.

What is October heat?

October heat, also called Second Summer, means a post-monsoon, pre-winter rise in temperature across the country. During the Southwest Monsoon, most parts of India become cooler due to rain, increased humidity, cloud cover, and sea breezes in coastal areas. However, as the monsoon progresses, temperatures increase and humidity decreases, locally increasing the 'October heat'. However, this term is a contradiction in itself, as the temperature rise often occurs during the first two weeks of November.

TOLL KA JHOL: MNS workers urge motorists not to pay the toll at Toll Nakas

Last week, HOME TIMES reported how Raj Thackeray led Maharashtra Navanirman Sena (MNS) staged an agitation against the increase in toll plaza rates at Anand Nagar Toll Naka at the Eastern Express Highway in Mulund East, and later on October 2, on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, MNS workers did a Gandhigiri style of protest. However, despite peaceful protests, the government does not seem to be taking back its decision on the hike in toll rates.

On Monday, MNS Chief Raj Thackeray, in a press conference on the issue of toll booths, warned the ruling BJP-Sena government that if the toll booths are not closed in the coming days, MNS workers will burn down the booths!

Acting on Raj Thackeray's appeal urging people to stop paying toll tax, MNS workers conducted another protest at the Mulund toll booth and appealed to people not to pay the toll. The MNS activist showed the video of Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis to motorists, addressing the fact that the toll for all small vehicles has been waived. Hence, MNS workers urged people to stop paying taxes as the government has waived the toll, but still, the corrupt government is illegally collecting the toll tax. Regrettably, instead of showing courage and stopping the toll tax, motorists ignored MNS activities while the Navghar police took the MNS workers into custody!



MNS worker sets toll cabin on fire

On the one hand, the Navghar police apprehended the MNS workers and stopped them from conducting the protest; on the other hand, the aggressive MNS workers tried to set ablaze a toll cabin. The MNS workers used motor tyres and inflammable materials and forcibly kept them inside a toll cabin. They were planning to blow the cabin off, but the police arrested them and aborted their plans. The scene was captured on CCTV.

Navghar police arrest MNS workers

After the Navghar police arrested the MNS workers, the agitators became more violent, and the scene turned explosive. However, thanks to the presence of mind of MNS leader Bala Nandgaonkar, who brought the situation under control by asking his workers to calm down.

Fire breaks out in the electrical system of a cabin

Meanwhile, a fire broke out in the electrical system of a cabin. Suspecting the fire as an attempt to burn down the cabin, the Navghar police registered cases against MNS leader Avinash Jadhav and 12 other MNS workers. Thane resident MNS worker Roshan Wadkar has been booked for burning the cabin. He was produced in court on Tuesday and sent to two days of police custody. He was later released on bail. It is believed that due to the fire in the toll

booth, the toll company has lost around two and a half lakhs.

Why did MNS workers burn the toll cabin?

MNS leader Avinash Jadhav said, "We had tried to set the toll cabin on fire because Raj Thackeray had stated that if the workers are protesting peacefully and even after that there is an attempt to arrest the MNS workers, then they should set these toll booths on fire. At Mulund toll Naka, we were peacefully conducting protests, but still, Navghar police arrested our workers; hence, in vengeance, we tried to burn down the toll cabin; however, before action, police arrested us."

MNS withdraws the toll-naka protest for a moment

MNS leader Avinash Jadhav and other workers were released late at night. MNS leader Bala Nandgaonkar has appealed to all the workers to abandon the protest at the toll naka.

The Congress party joins the toll hike protest

With the election around the corner, the hike in toll tax is hot, and every opposition party is eyeing the opportunity to take advantage of the situation and build a vote bank. Hence, after Maharashtra, Navnirman Sena, the Congress party, has also opposed the hiked toll tax. Mumbai Pradesh Congress President Varsha Gaikwad said that there should be a fair and comprehensive investigation into who is getting the money collected from the hiked toll prices.

Bhandup to have upgraded **Water Purification Center**

The Bhandup Water Purification Center is slated for reconstruction, accompanied by a significant expansion in its water purification capacity.

For the past three years, residents of Mumbai have been compelled to consume impure water due to the declining state of the existing water purification plant at Bhandup. Consequently, the BMC has resolved to undertake the construction of a new facility. The process involves a tender initiative, and construction is scheduled to commence by December 2023.

Mumbai residents currently

receive disinfected water from the Bhandup water purification plant within the Bhandup complex. However, the existing facility is approaching the end of its operational life. The current capacity of the plant is set to be augmented from 1910 million liters to 2000 million liters per day. The BMC has initiated a tender process for the construction of this facility, with an estimated cost of two crore rupees. The projected completion time for this endeavour is approximately four years. The revitalized facility is expected to treat and purify 2 thousand million liters of water daily. Currently, Panjrapol and

Bhandup complex jointly purify 3 thousand 850 million liters of water supplied to Mumbai daily. The Bhandup Complex water treatment plant ranks among the largest in Asia.

As part of this initiative, a pumping station will be established near Vihar Lake to harness the excess water from the lake, directing it to the Bhandup Water Purification Centre. The BMC anticipates a four-year timeline for the completion of this vital project. The senior engineer overseeing the project within the BMC water supply department has affirmed that the tender process will conclude within

the ongoing month, paving the way for actual construction to commence in December. Design and construction activities are progressing after engaging a contractor for the project.

Having been established 44 years ago, the water treatment plant at Bhandup Complex has shown signs of aging, necessitating the decision for a new water treatment facility five years ago. Being one of the largest water treatment plants in Asia, the upgraded capacity will ensure that Mumbaikars have access to clean drinking water, though this will materialize over the course of approximately four years.

Meanwhile, Mulund Police will also be monitoring the Navratri celebrations in Mulund through CCTV cameras. The police have appealed to the citizens that both the Mandals, devotees and citizens should follow the guidelines and celebrate Navratri with peace and joy.

However, since 2019, there has been an incessant decline in the purity of Mumbai water.

A senior BMC officer from the water department said, "There is a consistent drop in the quality of drinking water in Mumbai. We keep a hawk-eye on the quality of the water by daily sending 200 water samples from 24 wards in the city to the BIS. These tests are performed using filtration technology. These tests have ascertained the declining quality of water in Mumbai. As per recent reports, the water purity in Mumbai is a disappointing 0.99 percent. It is considered the worst in the last 3 years."

"The BMC is making efforts to purify the water and is also making efforts to maintain the old British-era water pipelines. However, until the city water becomes crystal clear, BMC has appealed to the citizens to boil water before drinking.

Generally, BMC collects 200 water samples every day, but during emergencies and monsoons, the number increases to 300 samples.

Post SRA building blaze CM issues orders to **install iron staircases**

Fire accidents are not ceasing to end in the city. A look back at the past few years reveals many civil hospitals and buildings were engulfed in fire due to a lack of fire safety measures. In a recent case, a devastating fire at the Slum Rehabilitation Authority (SRA) building in Goregaon, Mumbai, during the early hours of Friday, once again exposed the negligence of the

civic administration. Yet again, to cover the slackness of the government, Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde jumped into action and directed officials that SRA buildings should have iron stairs and emergency exits.

In the tragic fire incident at the Jai Bhawani building in Goregaon, eight people have died, more than 60 people injured who are undergoing treatment and fighting the battle of life and

death in civil hospitals.

Residents of the building attribute the rapid spreading of the fire to the wooden staircase. Hence, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has directed that, in the future all SRA buildings will have iron staircases and emergency exits. Shinde also directed officials to conduct structural and fire audits of the building and give it a facelift.

The fire has once again opened

Pandora's Box for the negligence of the government in the fire audit in the city. Attacking the poor attitude of the government in controlling fire, Mulundkar said, "What is outrageous is that the government wakes up momentarily when a fire accident hits the headlines. The action continues for a few days, and once the media forgets the issue, government action, too takes a back seat."

Government Approves Metro Depot at Kanjur Location Tenders Worth Rs 506/ Crores floated

The BJP has given the go-ahead for constructing a metro car depot in Kanjur, reversing their earlier opposition during the Mahavikas Aghadi's tenure. Their resistance has faded with their assumption of power, allowing this space to be utilized for the Metro 6 project. Tenders totalling 506 crores have been initiated for establishing this car depot. Construction is scheduled to begin upon the tender being awarded.


The Metro 6 route, spanning 13 stations from Jogeshwari to Vikhroli, along with the Kanjur car depot, has been granted approval. The coalition government has chosen to build the car depot at the original Kanjur site. A tender valued at 506 crores has been put forth for this purpose. The Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Board has taken control of this location from the Mumbai Suburban Collectorate. The aim is to complete the construction of the car depot within the next two and a half years. Initially, Mahavikas Aghadi had plans to construct a car depot for Metro 3 and Metro 6 at this location. However, upon regaining power, the Fadnavis government substituted the initially proposed Aarey site with a



Metro 3 car depot. The Metro 6 car depot will now be established on a 15-hectare plot in Kanjur.

During that time, the coalition government strongly opposed the Fadnavis government, alleging extensive tree felling in Aarey. Nonetheless, the Fadnavis government proceeded with the project at that site. Now, the Metro 6 car depot is slated to be constructed at the site initially proposed by Mahavikas Aghadi for the Metro Car Depot in Kanjur. Consequently, there is

a resurgence of accusations between the ruling party and the opposition. Previously, the Fadnavis government claimed an increase in the project cost for this car depot. However, with their own government choosing to construct the car depot at this location once again, there is surprise within the political sphere. The opposition is reacting, underscoring that if the decision regarding the car depot had been made earlier, it would have saved both cost and time in establishing the same car depot.

Lek Ladki Scheme - A boon for 7,000 families residing in Mulund

The state government is determined to enhance the female birth rate by promoting the birth of girls in the region. To this end, they have opted to phase out the 'Majhi Kanya Bhagyashree' scheme and launch the 'Lek Ladki' scheme. This initiative aims to financially assist girls from underprivileged families, with a total of one lakh one thousand rupees being earmarked in the girl's name until she reaches the age of 18.

The government's timely announcement of this scheme on World Girl's Day is a generous gift to the girls of the state. The 'Lek Ladki' scheme offers financial support to a girl child in a family holding yellow or orange ration cards—providing Rs. 5,000 at birth, Rs. 6,000 at the commencement of class I, Rs. 7,000 at class VI, Rs. 8,000 at class XI, and a substantial sum of Rs. 75,000 upon reaching 18 years of age. This scheme will be retroactively effective from

2023, benefiting approximately two and a half lakh girls in the state. The decision was made during a meeting presided over by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde.

Aditi Tatkare, Minister of Women and Child Development, emphasized the fundamental objective of empowering girls and women through this scheme. Key goals of the scheme include reducing the mortality rate of girls, curbing child marriages, addressing malnutrition, and ensuring universal education for girls.

In the 2023-24 budget speech, Deputy Chief Minister and then Finance Minister Devendra Fadnavis proposed extending benefits under the 'Lek Ladki' scheme. The revised 'Majhi Kanya Bhagyashree' scheme, operational since August 1, 2017, under the Department of Women and Child Development, will now transition into the 'Lek Ladki Yojana'. About five thousand beneficiaries

were eligible annually under the previous scheme, with an annual expenditure of about 12 crores. The funds for the 'Lek Ladki' scheme will be disbursed through Direct Beneficiary Transfer (DBT). A dedicated portal will facilitate the implementation of the scheme through the Integrated Child Development Service Scheme Commissionerate. Additionally, technical manpower will be provided through outsourcing to ensure smooth operation.

Under this scheme, one lakh rupees will be deposited in the girl's account gradually, leading up to her 18th birthday. The scheme will apply retrospectively from April 1, 2023, aligning with the International Day of the Girl Child. Approximately two and a half lakh individuals will benefit from the scheme, specifically yellow and orange ration card holder girls. Families with daughters born after April 1, 2023, or those

with a combination of a son and a daughter will also receive benefits. In cases of twin girls or a boy and a girl in the second delivery, the benefits will be extended accordingly. However, parents must undergo family planning surgery to be eligible for this scheme. If a girl or boy is born before April 1, 2023, followed by a second girl or twins, they will still be entitled to the scheme's benefits. The scheme is estimated to incur an expenditure of approximately Rs. 300 crores.

In Mulund, 7,000 yellow and orange ration card holders can directly avail the benefits of this scheme. An online portal will soon be launched to facilitate registration under this scheme. Families are encouraged to seize this opportunity by registering on the portal, providing all necessary details, including total financial income and meeting legal requirements, to ensure the funds are directly deposited into the girl's bank account.

Kudos to Navghar police for apprehending two felons

Navghar Police successfully apprehended two known felons engaged in criminal activities, attempting to commit theft in the Mulund East area during the night. The culprits already had a collective record of 17 theft-related cases against them. They are presently in custody, and investigations into the matter are ongoing.

Station, was conducting a routine patrol near Veer Savarkar Road, Swami Samarth Udyan on the 11th when he noticed two individuals hastily making their escape. This raised his suspicion, prompting a pursuit. The chase resulted in the capture of one of the individuals, identified as Akash Baig. A search of Akash

revealed a screwdriver in his possession. Akash divulged the identity of his accomplice, Ganesh Ramanna. Akash's inability to provide a satisfactory explanation regarding the screwdriver heightened suspicions. Upon cross-checking police records, it was verified that Akash had 7 cases registered against him at Navghar police station, while his

accomplice, Ramanna, had 10 cases on record. It was disclosed that both individuals had returned to Mulund and the surrounding areas to commit theft. Consequently, Navghar Police filed a case against them under section 401 of IPC, and the accused are presently in police custody.



TJSB ATM vandalised in Mulund: Thieves at large : Police launch investigation

A group of miscreants allegedly broke open an ATM of TJSB Bank on JN Road in Mulund West late Saturday night and escaped, damaging the cash dispenser and vandalising the ATM. The amount stolen is not revealed. Police are hunting the accused.

According to the Mulund Police, Naupada resident Reshma works as a manager at TJSB Bank on JN Road in Mulund West. On the night of October 7, Reshma received a phone call from a stranger informing her that some anti-elements were attempting to steal money by breaking the cash dispenser of the ATM at TJSB Bank.

Acting instantaneously on the complaint, Reshma rushed to the bank but was left disappointed to witness the ATM thieves escape after damaging the cash dispenser and vandalising the ATM. Nevertheless, she reported the matter to Mulund police. Mulund Police has registered a case under Sections 349, 427, and 511 of the IPC and is investigating the case. ATM thieves are absconding.



Two chain snatures arrested

In the affluent neighbourhood of Mulund, namely Swapnanagari, a distressing incident of gold chain snatching unfolded. Thieves forcefully grabbed a woman's gold chain and swiftly fled, leaving the woman injured. The Police are actively pursuing the thief who managed to escape with a gold chain valued at 36,000 rupees.

Recent times have seen a decline in gold chain snatchings, particularly targeting elderly men and single women in Mulund. However, these incidents are making sporadic reappearances. A parallel event took place in Mulund on Saturday, October 7th, where two culprits snatched a woman's



gold chain in the Swapna Nagri area and made a quick getaway, the theft occurring around 11:30 am.

The victim, Hira Doifode, had ventured out to purchase essential items from a chemist shop and proceeded to buy vegetables in the Swapna Nagri area. As she returned



home after her errands, two unidentified men on a two-wheeler approached her from behind. Violently, they pulled the gold chain from around her neck and rapidly fled, causing Hira to tumble to the ground due to the force of the act. This aggression resulted in minor injuries. The duo fled towards

the Swapnangari on a black Pulsar motorcycle, both being tall and of medium built.

In the aftermath of the distressing incident, Hira reported the crime to the Mulund police two days later, accompanied by her son. While such gold chain thefts had reduced in occurrence over the past few months, they now seem to be resurfacing. Police have recognized the method of operation in this case as the handiwork of the Irani gang, posing an ongoing challenge for the police force.

In this case Azad Jainwal and Manoj Kumar 2 accused are arrested by Mulund Police. This both accused are resident from Thane.

Teenager jumps to death in front of a running local train

In a bizarre suicide, a 13-year-old minor girl committed suicide by jumping in front of a fast local train at Mulund Railway Station. The deceased was a student of class VIII in the CBSE-affiliated BMC School at Mulund Mithagar. A resident of MHADA Colony, the family member of the deceased, said, "As usual, she came home from school at

the specified time. She took a bath and had lunch. Later, she left the house, informing her mother that she was going to her tuition." One of her building friends informed her, "She caught the bus and got down at Mulund station. She then entered platform number four of Mulund station and patiently waited for the train to arrive. When she saw the fast train approaching, she daringly jumped on

the tracks and was sped over by the running train!"

Commuters on the railway platform were left stunned by the bizarre accident. The police did not discover any suicide notes near the suicide spot. The police are thus investigating the cause of her death and interrogating her family members, school teachers, students, and tuition teacher.

Chain snatchers resurface in Mulund East

After a long time, a case of chain snatching has been exposed in Mulund East. A middle-aged woman walking down the Mulund fire station was looted of her gold chain by two people on the bike. The police are looking for the accused based on a technical investigation.

According to Navghar Police, Mulund East resident Rajshree

Kumthekar lost her gold chain on Thursday, October 5, at around 8:00 p.m. when she went out for work. In her complaint, Rajshree informed, "I was walking down the road near the fire station in Mulund East on Mahatma Phule Road when two men on a bike came from behind and snatched my 17-gram gold chain and fled." "I cried for help, but before people could come to my rescue, the

thugs sped away," she mourned. Later, Rajshree Kumthekar reported the complaint at the Navghar police station.

Reacting to the chain-snatching theft, a senior citizen from Mulund East said, "Crime in Mulund East is increasing. In the recent past, many incidents of molestation and mobile snatching, along with chain snatching, have been exposed in Mulund East. Due to increasing

crime, there is a sense of fear and terror among people. Hence, people are appealing to the Navghar police to increase the police patrol in this area."

Meanwhile, the senior police inspector of Navghar police station has assured the public to increase patrolling and has urged people to be vigilant about their surroundings and avoid speaking to strangers.

Housemaid's Heist : Pricey Gems Vanished

The Navghar police have lodged a complaint against a housemaid for stealing jewellery worth Rs 2 lakh. The police have not arrested the absconding housemaid.

According to Navghar Police, Vivek Joshi and his wife, a Mulund East resident staying at Satguru Sharan Tower, hired a housemaid (Kaamwali), Kavita Gupta, as Mrs. Joshi was sick. Kavita was appointed on August 14, 2023. She worked for a few days and did

good work. However, suddenly, on August 26, Kavita called Mrs. Joshi and informed her that she had quit the job. Before Mrs. Joshi could know the reason for her leaving the job, Kavita disconnected the phone!

On October 10, when Mrs. Joshi got well, she started doing her household chores. However, while cleaning the safe locker of her cupboard, she was left devastated to discover the jewellery kept inside the safe locker was missing! In her complaint, Mrs.

Joshi mentioned that the list of jewellery stolen included 20 grams of gold chain worth Rs 60,000/-, 10 grams of gold chain worth Rs 30,000/-, 20 grams of gold mangalsutra worth Rs 60,000/-, 10 grams of a gold ring worth Rs 30,000/-, and a 5-gram gold ring worth Rs 15,000/-.

Mr. and Mrs. Vivek Joshi complained about their housemaid, Kavita Gupta. Navghar Police Station has registered a case against and further investigation is on.

Mulundkar becomes a victim of virtual credit scam

Money is becoming more vulnerable to cybercriminals and hackers. After the physical debit card scam, citizens' money is being looted through virtual debit cards. A similar case of money being siphoned off from a virtual debit card has been registered at Mulund Police

his bank statement. After going through his bank statement, Mitesh was shocked to witness that truly Rs 1.09 lakh was siphoned off illegally from his account.

The next day, Mitesh registered a case. The police have registered a case under the IT Act against an unidentified criminal.

THIEVES 'SMARTLY' LOOT JEWELLERY WORTH RS 2.76 LAKH IN MULUND EAST

The total value of the stolen jewellery is reported to be Rs. 2.76 lakh. Navghar Police Station has registered a theft case and is investigating the case. Due to the increasing theft cases, the police have appealed to the citizens to take care of their valuables and keep valuables in a safe place like bank lockers to prevent such smart burglaries.

MULUNDKAR LOSES NINE LACS IN A FAKE CRYPTO CURRENCY SCHEME

The Cryptocurrency investment scams are increasingly burning holes in the pockets of investors. Last week, HOME TIMES had published how a Nahur resident lost Rs 9 lakh in a fake cryptocurrency investment. This week, another citizen from Mulund East and his

According to Navghar Police, Mulund East resident Deepak Gag met two crypto currency investors, Sandeep and Nayyar Khan, through a friend. The duo sang the glories of investment in crypto currencies and how the little investments

turned into mammoth amounts in a few days of the investment. They enticed Gag to invest in crypto currencies. They said that a small investment of Rs 1 lakh can help earn Rs 10,000 per month. Swept away by the luscious talks of Sandeep and Khan, Deepak invested 5 lakh rupees. Apart

from Sandeep, another acquaintance of Deepak invested Rs 4 lakh in this scheme.

Initially, Deepak Gag kept silent till he received money from the crypto currencies; however, when the return from the crypto currencies stopped coming, Deepak approached Sandeep and Khan and made a

complaint. Initially, the duo promised to help him, but later they went absconding. Deepak tried to call them, but they declined his calls. Deepak realised that he had been cheated. He lodged a complaint.

Navghar Police Station has filed a case under the IT Act against Sandeep and Khan.

Cyber Cell recovers Mulund resident's stolen amount

The cyber police were successful in recovering a substantial portion of the funds that were stolen from a senior citizen's credit card, delivering justice to the victim.

October 9, Ramesh Gajre witnessed 49,905 rupees being restored to his account, thanks to the diligent follow-up conducted by the Cyber Cell of the Mumbai Police. Gajre promptly reached out to the Mulund police to inform them that 80 percent of the stolen amount had been reimbursed to his credit card. This positive outcome was the product of the relentless efforts of the police and the proactive response exhibited by Gajre, ultimately leading to the recovery of a significant portion of his funds.

Two booked for attacking a street dog in Mulund

Navghar Police has registered a case under Section 379 of the IPC against an unknown person, and further investigation is underway.

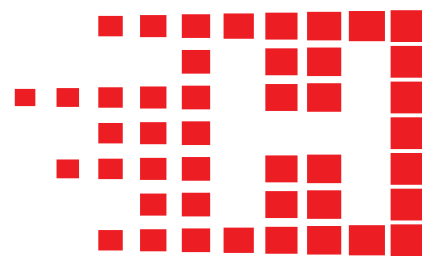
