



Dussehra: Triumph of Good over Evil

The nine-day festival of Navratri concludes with Dussehra or Vijayadashami. It is another cultural festival of great significance. This festival is celebrated to commemorate the victory of Lord Ram when he returned after his 14-year exile and the milestone victory over the evil demon king Ravana of Lanka. In North India and Mumbai, the Dussehra festival is celebrated along with Ramlila, a dramatized version of the Ramavan that terminates with the killing of the effigy of Ravana on Dussehra day. The significance of Dussehra is the golden message of victory over evil.

Apart from Dussehra, the festival is celebrated in other states of India with different names and traditions, like Durga Puja in West Bengal, Garba and Dandiya in Gujarat, or Chamundi in Karnataka. In a nutshell, these festivals worship diverse goddesses, but essentially, the essence of these festivals is the triumph of good over evil.

Polluted Smog Chokes Mumbai:

A Looming Health Crisis for Mumbaikars

health of Mumbai's residents is under severe threat, primarily stemming from large-scale construction projects, extensive roadworks, and the pervasive pollution caused by vehicular emissions. This peril has been amplified by the widespread pollution plaguing the city. Recently, on a fateful Friday, a dense shroud of polluted smog enshrouded Mumbai, rendering the city barely recognizable for a period of three to four hours during the morning.

Pollution levels have surged at multiple locations across Mumbai, including the suburb of Mulund, where it peaked at 150 on the scale. The atmosphere became laden with dust and smoke from the early hours, leading to the proliferation of fog throughout the city, drastically diminishing visibility to a mere 300 to 500 meters. The situation persisted throughout the day, leaving the citizens dubbing it as 'fog.' Bhandup recorded a pollution level of 157, while the city of Mumbai itself marked 111 on the scale. Notably, the highest levels of pollution were observed in the city's suburbs, particularly in areas like Mulund Bhandup, which currently witnessing extensive construction activities.

rampant construction activities in these regions have the movement necessitated of copious amounts of sand, cement, and gravel, leading to the generation of substantial dust and emissions from demolition.

Moreover, the heightened road traffic has contributed to a surge in smog-inducing pollutants. Alarmingly, there's growing consensus that the suburbs of Mumbai may have now eclipsed even Delhi in terms of pollution levels.

Post the monsoon season, the land becomes laden with fine sand, facilitating the mixing of pollution, soil, and construction dust in the atmosphere. The absence of strong winds at this time exacerbates the issue, enveloping Mumbai in a hazy veil created by airborne dust particles and significantly reducing visibility.

Sunil Kamble, the Head the Mumbai Regional Meteorological Department, provides insight into situation, stating, "After the rainy season, the land becomes sandy. So, pollution, construction dust mixes in the air. As there is no wind at this time, Mumbai looks smoky due to the dust particles floating in the air, and visibility is reduced."

Mithagar Road Public Navratri Utsav Mandal in Mulund East is marking its 58th year of celebration with a 6-foot idol of Maa Durga.





Mumbai on Red Alert as Dengue and Malaria Return

Mumbaikars Beware!! The deadly dengue and malaria are back in Mumbai with a vengeance! According to the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), between September 1 and September 25, Mumbai recorded a total of 1,031 dengue cases, marking a significant increase from 353 cases in June, 685 in July, and 999 in August.

In Mulund, the BMC T-Ward informed Mulund that it has registered a whopping 52 cases of dengue and 27 cases of malaria within the past 18 days, ringing an alarm for the concern of the T-Ward administration. The T-ward administration is thus working around the clock. On one hand, while the BMC is spraying fumigants and pesticides from time to time, on the other hand, the citizens are urged to be careful and vigilant about these growing diseases.

Mosquito-borne diseases are giving sleepless nights to Mumbaikars. According to the BMC Health Department, the monsoon season in Mumbai is now over, but even after the monsoon, dengue and malaria cases are increasing, making life miserable for the citizens. Malaria, dengue, lepto, and swine flu cases have almost doubled in a week in Mumbai. According to the BMC data, from October 1 to October 8, Mumbai registered 211 cases of malaria, while 250 cases of dengue were reported. In Mulund T ward, 52 cases of dengue and 27 cases of malaria have been registered in 18 days.

BMC is working to control the increase in dengue cases

Dr. Daksha Shah, executive health officer at BMC, said, "I agree that the rate at which the number of affected people is increasing is also alarming. As the city continues to reel under the dengue onslaught, the BMC insecticide department has been detecting over 900 breeding spots of Aedes mosquitoes per day for the last two months. The Aedes aegypti mosquitoes are responsible for spreading dengue, chikungunya, and zika."

She said, "BMC has now sought the help of citizens, as most of these breeding spots are indoors and in surrounding areas in housing societies. We have an app in Mumbai against dengue where we are requesting citizens to get enrolled. They should search for breeding spots and inform us. Citizen participation is the most important link to controlling the dengue menace, as most of the breeding happens around houses and workplaces."

Dr Shah informed "The Municipal Health Department has increased the reporting units, due to which timely investigations are being conducted and more cases are being detected."

Creating awareness among the citizens about dengue

Apart from the action against mosquitoes, the BMC is also holding a dengue awareness drive in Mumbai. There are two teams. The awareness team is conducting door-to-door drives to inform people about mosquito breeding. The other team's work is to find and destroy larvae."

Remedies to prevent dengue

Do not allow water to collect around the house or inside the house.

If there is water in the cooler, keep it with kerosene oil; this reduces the chances of mosquito breeding.

Do not leave water tanks open; keep them well covered.

These days, wear clothes with full sleeves and cover the legs as much as possible.

METRO-4 TO BE LAUNCHED IN 2026 ON

MULUND TO GHODBUNDER ROUTE

Mulundkars who are desperately waiting to travel via Metro train may have to wait a few more years to their dream. achieve Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority, i.e., MMRDA, has announced that Metro-4 will be launched by the year 2026. The metro will be divided into two phases. The first phase would work between Ghodbunder and Mulund and would be launched in 2026. The MMRDA informed us that the reason behind the delay is

the contractor's slow work, and the MMRDA is taking stringent action against the contractor.

Informing about the progress of Metro-4 and its plans, a senior MMRDA officer said, "The Mumbai Metro Line 4 (Wadala-Kasaravadavali) is 32.32 km long and has 32 stations from Wadala to Kasaravadavali. In the first phase, we are planning to make the Metro-4 corridor operational by 2025. However, there are many technical aspects to consider before opening it to the public. Hence, Metro-4 service will be available for the

public until 2026–27 to travel on this route."

The official added, "The construction of the metro line on Ghodbunder Road from Mulund to Thane is in progress. Seven stations are to be constructed between Mulund Fire Station and Majiwada Junction. In these seven stations, Mulund Fire Brigade, Mulund Naka, Tin Hat Naka, RTO Thane, Mahanagar Palika Road, Cadbury Junction, and Majiwada station This Metro service will reduce travel time for residents in Mulund and Thane."

The MMRDA confirmed that what looks easy on paper is not going to be a smooth ride in practice. The negligence of the contractor awarded the work has made things complicated. The metro work on the LBS route and other places has been carried out at a snail's pace for the past several months. Hence, MMRDA fired the contractor and decided to complete the pending works through sub-contractors on behalf of MMRDA.

Commuters may have to wait until 2026 to travel on this route of the Metro.





In the wake of recent protests and acts of vandalism stemming from a toll rate increase, the Anandnagar toll plaza, situated along the Eastern Express Highway, has witnessed noteworthy improvements. This week, the pity dog died during the treatment! The death of the dog has generated anger among animal lovers, and they are demanding to make the law strict. CCTV footage of this attack is becoming increasingly viral on social media.

Last week, HOME TIMES reported that the police had booked Ocean Chinese Hotel owner Neeraj Nepali and Shankar Agarkar, his servant, under Section 34, 428 of the IPC and the Animal Cruelty Act. However, soon after the arrest, the two accused got bail, as the crime was a bailable offense.



The release of the accused has made animal lovers more furious at the meek law against animals. An animal lover violent over the ruthless attack on the dog and the subsequent bail of the accused said, "It is regrettable that the accused is roaming free when the innocent and mute animal is dead." He asked, "In the case of humans, when a person assaulted by the accused

dies in the hospital during the treatment, the law immediately changes and the accused is booked in a more serious murder case. If the law can punish a human for murder, then why not charge an accused of brutality against an animal (if the animal is killed) in a murder case? Is an animal, not a living creature?

HOME TIMES supports animal lovers and demands that, in the case of the death of an animal by the hand of a human being, it be made stringent. Section 34, 428 of the IPC and the Animal Cruelty Act need alteration, and the accused of killing an animal should be punished severely. Besides, the death of an animal should also be considered a case of murder! The bail-able clause should be removed, and the charge must be made nonbail-able.

Rail Neer bottles Disappear from Railway Shelves

Rahul Himalian, Group General Manager (West Zone), IRCTC, informed us, "We regret the curtailment of supply of packaged drinking water from Rail Neer due to the maintenance work at Ambernath water plant." He added, "Every month, the production of Rail Neer water bottles are reduced for two days due to the primary maintenance at the water plant. In addition, twice a year, the plant undertakes 15-day stringent maintenance; hence, there is less production of Neer Water bottles. But the production will boost, and water bottles will be available on October 22, 2023."

BMC DUMPER COLLIDES WITH HANDICAP TRICYCLE

IMD WARNS OF CYCLONE TEJ IN THE ARABIAN SEA ON THE WEEKEND

Dear Mumbaikars, if you are planning a weekend at Marine Drive on Saturday 21 and Sunday 22, then twice as the think India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted a cyclone. An officer from IMD said, "A low-pressure area has formed in the southeast of the Arabian Sea, which may turn into a strong cyclone in the next two to three days. Its intensity is not yet estimated, but it is believed that it may intensify gradually." "Currently, it is being

monitored. A lowpressure area is also developing in the Bay of Bengal, parallel to the Arabian Sea," he added.

Meanwhile, Mumbai recorded a maximum temperature of 36.4

degrees Celsius on Wednesday, which is the highest mercury level so far in October this year. However, strong winds and rains are expected in Mumbai due to this strong storm, which might be a huge relief to Mumbaikars struggling with the October heat.

KHICHDI SCAM: ED RAIDS MULTIPLE PLACES IN MULUND

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) conducted searches at seven locations – the premises of Deputy Commissioner of the BMC, Sangeeta Hasnale, Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Suraj Chavan, and five private contractors – on Wednesday in connection with the ₹6.7 crores Covid-19 'khichdi scam'. In Mulund also the ED raided many places.

The Khichdi scam is about the illegal bagging of a contract by the accused for preparing khichdi for migrant laborers during the pandemic. The Bharatiya Janata Party leaders had accused Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray of defrauding crores of rupees in khichdi that was provided to the citizens during the Corona period. A demand was also made for an impartial investigation by other agencies. In this sensitive connection, a total of 7 locations across Mumbai including Mulund were raided by the ED and others on Wednesday. These include Sneha Caterers and Decorations and Golden Star Hall and Banquet located in Mulund West.

Apart from this, the raids also extensively covered the premises of contractors and sub-contractors like Vaishnavi Kitchen/Sahyadri Refreshment in Parel, FNJ Enterprises operating the Persian Darbar Hotel in Goregaon, and firefighters. Enterprises in Govandi, and Western India Logistics in Chembur are also included.

ED launched its money-laundering probe based on a September first tip report by Mumbai Police's Economic Offenses Wing (EOW), which alleged irregularities of Rs 6.37 crore in the case.

Conman Swindle Bhandup Man with Fake Gold Ornaments

Raju agreed.

A few days later, Raju called Pednekar and asked if he was willing to buy the gold ornaments and ready to meet the goldsmith. Pednekar nodded, and the two met a jeweller. The jeweller took a close look at the gold ornaments and verified that they were genuine gold. Assured about the gold ornaments being pure gold, Pednekar had a clandestine meeting with Raju and his brother at the Vihar Hotel in Mulund (East), where Raju and his brother handed the

gold ornaments to Pednekar, and Pednekar paid them Rs 5.50,000/-.

After obtaining the gold ornaments, delighted Pednekar showed the ornaments to his trusted family goldsmith, who disclosed that the gold ornaments were fake worth a penny! A disappointed, Pednekar then reported the matter to the Navghar police. The Navghar police station has registered a case under Section 420 of the IPC against Raju and his brother and the police hunting the fraudsters.

fraud, Mahesh clicked the link and submitted the requisite information. However, no sooner did he disclosed his vital information he was stunned to witness Rs 1,97,888/- siphoned off from his bank account.

Mahesh reported the fraud to Mulund Police Station. The Mulund Police is currently investigating the matter further.

REJECTED WEDDING PROPOSAL ENDS IN TRAGEDY

Mulund police bust the Bol Bachchan gang and its mastermind
